1. If we were writing a letter of encouragement to a fellow believer who was undergoing hardship, what sort of things might you include?
2. Read v1-3. Who is at work in our salvation? What comfort should these verses bring us?
3. Read v3-9. What reasons does Peter give for praising God? Why do you think it is helpful to be reminded of all that God has done for us?
4. The Christians to whom Peter is writing were undergoing persecution. How does Peter encourage them? Do Peter's words bring us any encouragement (see especially v6-7)?
5. Read v13-16. Verse 13 is a 'hinge' verse which links what follows with what has just come. What do you think this verse is telling us to do and how, practically, can we do it?
6. Read v14-15. These verses present flip sides of the same coin. Who is being spoken to? What are they being asked to do and why? What might help us want to be holy and to not conform to our former evil desires?
7. Read v17-21. These can be tricky verses to understand. What do you think the main idea is and what should this cause us to do?

- If there was one thing you could highlight that God is challenging you about to pray over / change / seek His help in, what is it?
- Is there one thing you are going to take away with you as an encouragement?
- What can others pray for you to help you respond to His challenge?
