

1 Peter 3:13-16 – Chosen to set Christ apart as Lord

REVIEW: Can you remember what you looked at in your last home group meeting? What impact has this made to your life and walk with God?

Read 1 Peter 3:13-17.

1. What are the most likely threats and fears that YOU face for being a Christian today (don't belittle even the small ones – they are still real)?
2. What do you think it means to set Christ apart as Lord in your hearts (v15)? Does 3:22 have any impact on how we view Jesus as Lord? And is there anything that might stop us having him as our Lord?
3. What is the link between 3:14 and 3:15? Explore this a little.
4. Spend a few minutes reviewing some of the things we have learnt about our hope from 1 Peter so far.
5. Peter tells us that we should be prepared to give a reason for this hope. Unless we have actually thought about this, it may prove trickier than we think. Share why you have the hope that you do.
6. The last part of v15 suggests there is a good way and a bad way to answer for our hope. What do you think answering with 'gentleness and respect' means? When might this be hard?
7. 1 Pet 3:16 expands our witness beyond merely verbal. Why is it important to have a life that matches our mouths (think about this in relation to 3:15a)?

AND FINALLY – APPLY & RESPOND:

- If there was one thing you could highlight that God is challenging you about to pray over / change / seek His help in, what is it?
- Is there one thing you are going to take away with you as an encouragement?
- What can others pray for you to help you respond to His challenge?
