

### How to find us:

**From M5:** follow A39 towards Glastonbury/Wells. Pass through Walton, continue on A361 through roundabout by McDonalds and along dual carriageway. At next roundabout, turn right into Street. The church is less than 100 yards on your right.

**From Wells:** follow signs to Glastonbury. At roundabout into Glastonbury, turn right along by-pass. Continue following signs to Street. At roundabout on entrance to Street, turn left into Street. The church is less than 100 yards on your right.

**From Yeovil:** follow signs to Somerton. Do not turn into Somerton, but continue to follow signs to Street. Enter Street and continue along the road until the first roundabout. Continue straight across the roundabout into Glaston Road. The church is 100 yards on your left.

## Introducing Street Baptist Church

Our vision is that we love and enjoy God for His glory by hearing and accepting His word so that we may become more like Christ, love His people, and serve Him in the church and the world.



## Just to let you know ...

... that a person from Street Baptist Church called around to see you today. We hope that you do not mind that we should call, and that it will allow you to get to know us better.

## The trouble is ...

... so few people have any idea what a church is all about. Very few are taken to church as children, and so most people don't really know what to expect. So what is Street Baptist Church all about?

## About us

Actually, Street Baptist Church is full ordinary people - Dads, school kids, teachers, OAPs, babies, business men, brickies. In fact, we are all people with normal jobs and hobbies, doing things other people do. Only one thing is different - we know we are not, and can never be, right before God by trying to do our best. Church is not a club for people who think that they can be good enough for God. It is a where those who know they have got it all wrong meet with God who can make us all right.

And this is important for everyone to realise! We can never be right with God. You can't try to pretend that everything is Ok. The Bible tells us that only God can make us right with Him. And so God sent Jesus, His Son, to die for those who will trust Him. And this changes everything! Lives transformed, future sorted! We hope that you will see the difference God makes in the way we live our lives, worship God and love one another.

## Sundays

On Sundays we meet at 11am and 6.30pm. Our Sunday meetings are designed to help people worship God and get to know Him better. The morning meeting is child-friendly, and after 25 minutes the children and teenagers go on to other activities specially suited to their age-groups. We believe that the Bible is God's word and is totally relevant to our lives today, and so all groups spend time thinking through what the Bible has to say for us today.

You will find over 150 people in our morning meeting, and between 60 and 80 are at our evening meeting, across all age groups. We know you will feel very 'at ease' amongst us even if you have never been to church before!

## Some other activities

Home groups meet fortnightly in people's homes. These are a great way to get alongside others who are learning more about God and His word, discuss the passages together, and pray for one another.

## Mums & Toddlers Group

This group is an excellent way to meet up with other Mums from the area, and for your toddlers to get to know one another. A vibrant group, it is fun for your kids and a real support for Mums.

## Children

As well as the Sunday activities for children we run youth clubs on Thursday and Friday. Up to 50 young people from the area meet in these clubs every week. We also run summer Holiday Clubs and kid's parties at various times of the year. New young people are always welcome - your parents don't have to come to the church for you to join us!

## Meet the Pastor

The Pastor of the church is Alwyn Barry. Born in Leeds, brought up in Belfast, he eventually settled in Bath. He worked as a University lecturer in Computer Science. He has been the Pastor at the church since 2007. He is married with four children, all in local schools. Although brought up to go to church, Alwyn realised while still young that he was wrong with God. He realised that he had to get right with God, and that Jesus had died for Him. And so, in his room at home, he prayed and asked Jesus to forgive him and become his saviour.



## Your story?

Do you have a story like this? Most people realise that they are not right before God. Some try to ignore it by saying 'there is no God', but deep down they know the truth. Others try to hide it by thinking 'It'll be Ok', but how can it be? Others think 'I'll try my best'. But, sadly, the more we try the more we only fail. I knew a teenage girl who once was given a challenge: 'Try to go a whole week without breaking one of God's commandments'. 'Easy!', she said. Unfortunately that first morning she immediately lied about her college work to her Mum. The next day she blew up with her sister. Try as she might, each day that week she failed. Actually, the Bible tells us that we cannot do it! Try it for yourself and see! We have a nature that does not allow us. But Jesus once told a man who had tried really, really hard but failed: "You must be born again". In other words, we don't need new resolutions, but a new life. The great news for failures like us is that Jesus died for you to bring new life! But, like any gift, you must accept it before you can have it.
